


At 4 o'clock she wasn't at home. She was at the sports club.

She was playing tennis. She wasn't watching television.



(past continuous)

What did he do when the phone rang?
He stopped reading and answered the phone.


(past simple)

Jack began reading before the phone rang. So: When the phone rang, he was reading.

- Jack read a book yesterday. (= from beginning to end)
- **Did** you watch the film on television last night?
- It didn't rain while we were on holiday.

past continuous

• A: What were you doing at 10.30?
B: We were playing tennis.



- Jack was reading a book when the phone rang.
- Were you watching television when I phoned you?
- It wasn't raining when I got up.
- I started work at 9 o'clock and finished at 4.30. At 2.30 I was working.
- It was raining when we went out, (= it started raining before we went out)
- I saw Lucy and Steve this morning. They were waiting at the bus stop.
- Jenny fell asleep while she was reading.
